

The Champaign County Drug Free Youth Coalition operates as a committee of the Family and Children First Council. The Coalition is currently experiencing infrastructure changes in regards to committee work and losing staff in key roles (administration and youth council coordinator). The Coalition is committed to identifying appropriate replacements in these key roles and to continue to adapt the Coalition's structure to meet the needs of the group and community.

The Coalition has been instrumental in furthering collective impact conversations with members of the Council and the Champaign Health District's Community Health Improvement Plan leadership team. The Coalition/Council staff are locally viewed as the expert in community change by community partners. The key stakeholders have taken a great deal of interest in the evaluation components of the Coalition's operation and how those efforts assist the Coalition in telling our story and successes. We continue to use data to guide all decision making. We have seen our indicator data changing in a positive way in the past two years and have 4 of 5 school districts implementing universal evidence-based prevention. The Coalition is assisting the 5th district in grant writing in preparation for implementation.
