

4. Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.):

The Health Department survey tool that was used showed an overall 100% increase in parental self-esteem, knowledge of positive parenting practices and knowledge of child development. Active Parenting Now 3 and 1, 2,3, 4 Parents surveys were more difficult to calculate. Many parents completed the pre test, but may not have completed the post test. We did not include those results in our numbers due to the fact we couldn't show how the parents felt after the programming about what they had learned. There was, however an increase in positive parenting practices and knowledge of child development in 83% of people who completed the parenting classes. Parent's expressed overall appreciation for the programming that was provided.
