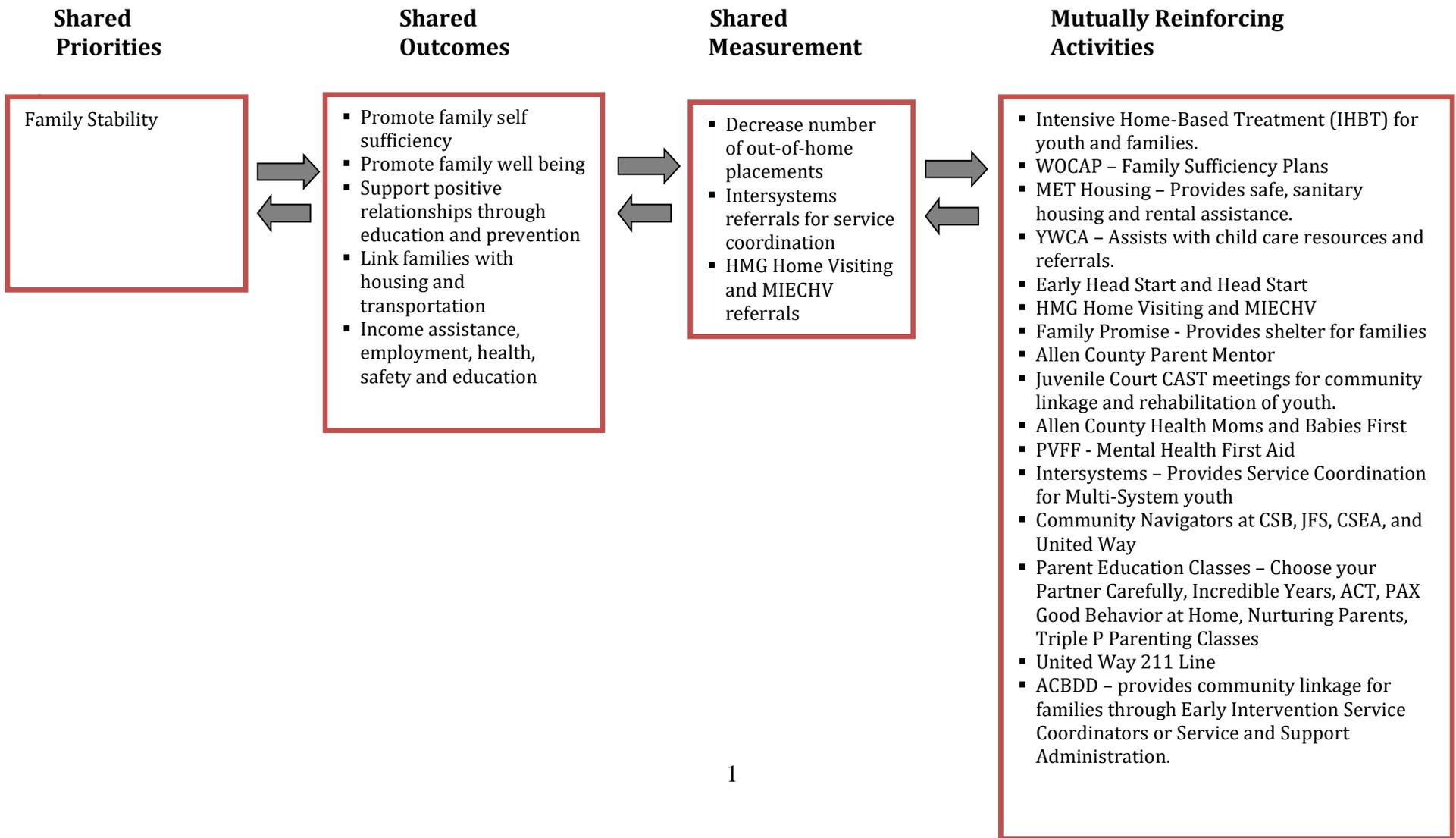
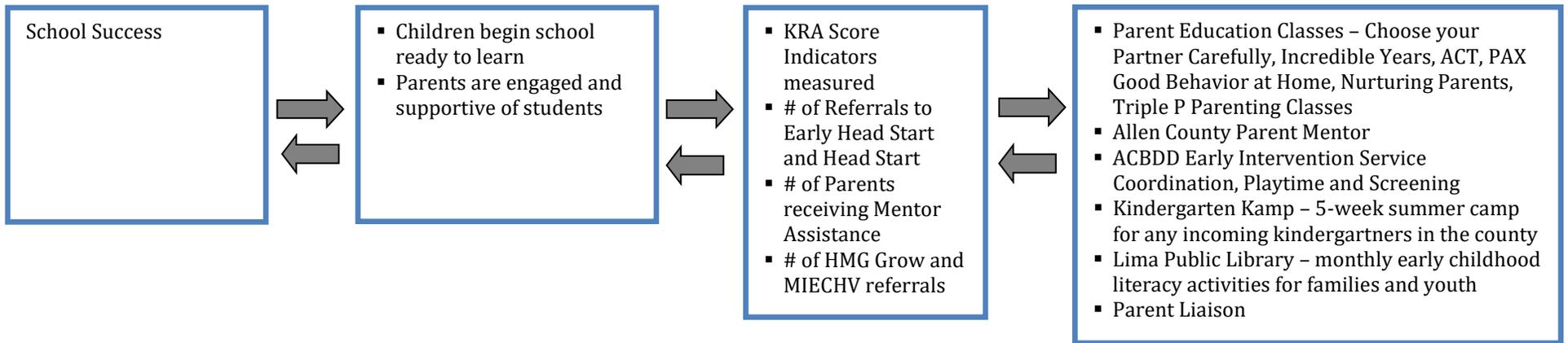


# Allen County Family and Children First Council Shared Plan Update for SFYs 17-19
