

211 system moved from Greater Cincinnati United Way to Greater Dayton United Way in June 2017

No Wrong Door has been in the planning stages and has not yet launched

2. Identify any successes/how implementing this plan has worked to strengthen the council and county collaboration.

A subset of FCFC member agencies have created a training plan, MOU and resource directory to support a launch of No Wrong Door in August 2017. There has been strong buy in and energy about this initiative.

The creation and distribution of approximately 60,000 Community Resources rack cards helped to direct community members and professionals to local resources.

Butler County United Way recently moved their 211 services from the Greater Cincinnati United Way to the Greater Dayton United Way. Marketing for 211 will begin in earnest in August 2017. The launch of the “No Wrong Door” initiative will begin at that time as well.

It is possible that the distribution of 60,000 Social Services Rack cards into the community has led to less of a need for 211 services. It could also be that as we move forward with No Wrong Door, there will be less of a need to call 211.
