

Training Steps for **decrease in Toxic Stress**

How to be a Family-Centered Service Coordinator

- a. Online training module completed by 6 early intervention service coordinators and EI supervisor on 1/31

Working with Young Children with Anxiety

- b. Huntington, WV on 1/30; attended by Ron Sims, DD Psychologist (consultant to EI team)

How to be a Family-Centered Practitioner

- c. Online training module completed by 4 early intervention primary service providers on 1/31

Have scheduled inservice training with Jimmy Beirne, Behavior Consultant, to discuss how to create environments that promote resiliency; behavior management, etc. Training will be on August 15, 2017 at the Early Childhood Center

BackPack Buddies delivered meals to 32 children on Thursday of each month

Food Drive via LCBDD awareness month completed in March/April; all donations to BackPack Buddies

Provided early intervention services via home visits to 59 infants/toddlers with delays and disabilities, including families referred to early intervention as a result of substantiated child abuse/neglect as well as babies born with neonatal abstinence syndrome

Contacted Reach for Tomorrow to obtain baby boxes for distribution to targeted early intervention families

In regards to activities for Substance Abuse Prevention

IMPACT Prevention has MOUs from Ironton City, Dawson-Bryant and Rock Hill Schools to collect data through the Ohio Healthy Youth Environments Survey (OH YES!) starting fall 2017 through 2019. We also have Family Medical Centers, Ironton Health Department and Lawrence County Health Department MOUs to collect national outcomes measures on adults age 18-25 during that same time frame. Ironton on the Move Coalition is the group that is heading this charge.

IMPACT Youth Empowerment Activities Summer Youth Camp

LCHD's activities related to decreasing infant mortality:

- We continue to provide pack 'n plays for infants who don't have a safe place to sleep. Sessions for pack 'n plays lasts about 40 minutes. It includes watching a video, and education is provided regarding a number of things, including not sharing their beds with their infants, tobacco use, ABCs (babies alone, back and in a crib), use of a pacifier, dressing for the temperature of the home, etc. Parents get a safe-sleep survival kit that includes a blanket sleeper, sheet, pacifier, safe sleep educational materials, a book for the baby, a dvd for the parent/caregiver. We add a 2nd sheet and 2nd pacifier to their kit.
- We talk to expectant moms in our prenatal clinics as well as expectant or new moms who come in for pack 'n plays about the dangers of them smoking during pregnancy. We also discuss the danger 2nd and 3rd hand smoke can cause their infants. They are encouraged to stop smoking or, at the very least, to smoke outside and change their clothes and wash their hands before holding the baby
- Per grant requirements for FY17, we are doing a safe sleep education campaign for organizations and helping them enact safe sleep policies. We have already met with WIC and have several others scheduled.
- We provide education on importance of immunizations for preventable childhood diseases and encourage timely immunizations. Appointments are given and reminder recalls are set up for an on-going immunization schedule
- We have a car seat program
- Our BCMH nurse works with children with special health care needs and their families to help obtain comprehensive care and services
- We provide prenatal vitamins with folic acid for positive pregnancy tests done at the health department (and women with negative pregnancy tests are provided multi-vitamins with folic acid)
