


Logan County Family and Children First Council Shared Plan Update for SFYs 17-19

1. Identify any barriers in implementing the plan (i.e. data collection, data tracking, funding, infrastructure, etc.)

Due to turnover in positions, including the Director role, within Logan Co FCFC, there was infrastructure difficulty in not only collecting the data, but also in tracking the data and ensuring the priorities were addressed appropriately. Now that FCFC is operating at full capacity the organization is able to focus on the initially set goals. The organization will continue to evaluate whether the priorities, outcomes, indicators, and strategies make sense for the population served and will continue to update and change the Shared Plan over the course of the year to best serve the highest needs within the community.

2. Identify any successes/how implementing this plan has worked to strengthen the council and county collaboration.

As a success, FCFC and the Coalition Advisory Board were able to secure a CareSource Foundation Grant allowing them to continue working in the data tracking system, REACH, alongside staff to continue to input data from several coalitions and agencies to better track where gaps and needs are in the community. This grant over the course of the next year will provide FCFC alongside these other agencies and coalitions to become more involved in the services taking place here. Other successes are the development of the Service Coordination Mechanism committee to review the SCM document and make changes based on the changes in the county and how we serve multi-system youth and families. This collaboration between the agencies that frequently have multi-system involvement are all a piece of this collaborative effort and are taking pieces of the mechanism back within their agencies to ensure that we are working at the highest caliber to serve these families. Logan County FCFC also was awarded the Stronger Families, Safe Communities grant which will allow us to bring programming to the county surrounding trauma informed care, truant teens, loving solutions and support for both children and their parents in the form of classes offered through the program. The grant also allows the agency to break down typical barriers for families to attend by offering childcare, dinner at classes, and help with transportation.

In staffing a new program coordinator at the beginning of SFY17, FCFC took the approach that hi-fidelity wraparound with eligible families would be implemented and there would be an increase in partners within the community who are trained in hi-fidelity as well as those being served within either Wraparound or the ENGAGE program.

Due to staff changes and lack of trainers for Bridges out of Poverty, FCFC did not provide this training in SFY 17. FCFC will evaluate the need within the community. If Council decides the need is still presented, FCFC will look to become trained to facilitate this training and provide it to families. However, FCFC has offered cross-systems numerous times with multiple agency participation. FCFC is still working to become a trauma-informed agency with the hopes of being able to pilot these practices, especially in now having support through the Stronger Families, Safe Communities Grant.

There are already several community groups working on the issues of substance abuse (CORE and CAB) and depression/suicide (Suicide Prevention Coalition) in Logan County. Logan County Family and Children First will work to increase the capacity of these coalitions to look at issues specific to youth in community to expand their ability to make health decisions about their future.
